## PAY LESS NOTICES—THE

### Payment in the construction industry has been a hot topic for many years.

Whether it is a payment between employer and main contractor, or among main contractors and subcontractors, the chance of a dispute remains higher in construction than it does in most industries.

A pay less notice is the opportunity for a paying party to change their mind on what has already been agreed on payment, altering the payment due to the payee near to the end of the payment cycle, in the form of a written notification.

Current legislation implies into all construction contracts the right to adjudicate; it is a form of speedy dispute resolution that is designed as a 'pay now, argue later' mechanism providing a binding, but not final, decision to ensure cash flow during construction projects.

For a pay less notice to be valid, it must:

- Comply with the Construction Act, the contract or scheme.
- Be presented correctly, showing the basis of the calculated sums and the reasons for which, the sums have been calculated.

- Be clear and obvious that the document served is a pay less notice; any confusion will result in a void notice.
- Be proven to be delivered to the payee and issued within time before the final date for payment. If it is not issued on time and in compliance with the contract and the relevant legislation, then the last notified sum is the amount to be paid.





# KNOW YOUR CONSUMER PROTECTION SCHEMES

Gemma Swankie from **QUALITY ASSURED NATIONAL WARRANTIES (QANW)** sets the record straight around consumer protection schemes and explains what contractors need to check when they are looking for policies.

## IS YOUR CONSUMER PROTECTION SCHEME WORTH PAYING FOR?

The world of consumer protection isn't always clear, especially if you start looking into the small print and disclaimers. Generally, we take what we are sold at face value.

Unfortunately, there are some organisations which use smoke and mirror tactics to sell 'consumer protection' that, when it comes down to it, offers very little financial protection for homeowners or certainty for contractors.

## KNOW YOUR POLICY

When you're looking for protection for your customer, the key thing to remember is to make sure that you are dealing with a UK Authorised Insurer offering a genuine insurance policy. If your scheme only talks about 'guarantees' rather than 'insurance' they may not be insuring your risk with a bona fide policy in favour of your customer. It is always worth checking with your provider if this is the case.

It comes down to the value of your reputation. Do you know what your financial protection actually offers your customers when you decide to retire, or start working with someone

# ACTIS: USE INSULATION WHICH KEEPS HOMES COOL

Insulation specialist **ACTIS** has reminded architects of the importance of ensuring buildings remain cool in the summer as well as warm in winter.

This follows an appeal by the Grantham Research Institute on Climate Change and the Environment, part of the London School of Economics (LSE).

Its policy director, Bob Ward, said in a letter to the Prime Minister: *"Summer heatwaves have killed thousands of people over the past few years, and many lives could have been saved by a better strategy for managing heat risks."*

Actis says that one small element which could mitigate the effects of extreme heat is to install insulation which can cool a building as well as keep it warm.

Its UK and Ireland sales director, Mark Cooper, said: *"Reflective insulation technologies have the ability to counteract heat transfer via radiation. This helps to reflect the solar heat and keep the property at a constant low relative temperature."*

*"However, no insulation can address the effects of solar gain through windows. This needs to be addressed by judicious use of curtains or siting the windows in strategic positions."*

His comments also address concerns raised by Professor Paul Wilkinson of the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, who stated that insulation can exacerbate overheating.

Mark added: *"With many types of insulation this can be the case, but not with reflective products."*

## LOW PITCH ROOFING IS TOPS FOR EXTENSIONS

Low pitch roofing systems could be the 'go to' solution for roofing contractors this summer, following a relaxation in planning regulations that has made it simpler for homeowners to add an extension.

The **ISOLINE ONDUTILE** underlay system, from Onduline Building Products, is perfect for projects requiring very low pitches, which can be as low as 12.5° for interlocking concrete tiles, 17.5° for clay pantiles, natural and fibre cement slates, and 22.5° for plain double-lap tiles.

# THREE THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN SPECIFYING ROOF ACCESS HATCHES

Tony Stevens, Technical Estimator at **BILCO UK**, discusses the key factors that should be taken into consideration when selecting roof access hatches

## Purpose for access

To make sure you're choosing the correct system, you must first identify the main reason for requiring access to the roof.

- *Is it purely for maintenance reasons?*
- *Or will a safe means of regular access also be required?*
- *Will people be carrying tools?*

## Frequency and product specification

It is important to specify the correct roof access hatch and ladder combination so that access from the ladder, through the roof access hatch, is as safe as possible.

If space is limited, a fixed vertical ladder is appropriate. A companionway or retractable ladder is also suitable; however, the roof access hatch length must be extended to around 1,500 mm to provide safe access.

A minimum head clearance of 120 mm is also required, whilst the maximum single climb should be no more than three metres, in accordance with BS 4211-7.2.

Where regular access is required, a fixed staircase roof access hatch should be specified with a companionway ladder or a fixed staircase. The roof hatch must also allow for a head clearance of 2,000 mm, as required by Part K of the Building Regulations.

## Bespoke requirements

To meet the project's specific requirements, consider whether a custom-made roof access hatch is more suitable, such as Bilco UK's SKY Flatglass, which functions as both a roof access hatch and smoke ventilator, whilst its clear lid allows daylight into the building.

Increased access opening sizes should also be explored where required for larger items, while motorised options enable safe contact with the ladder when entering or exiting.

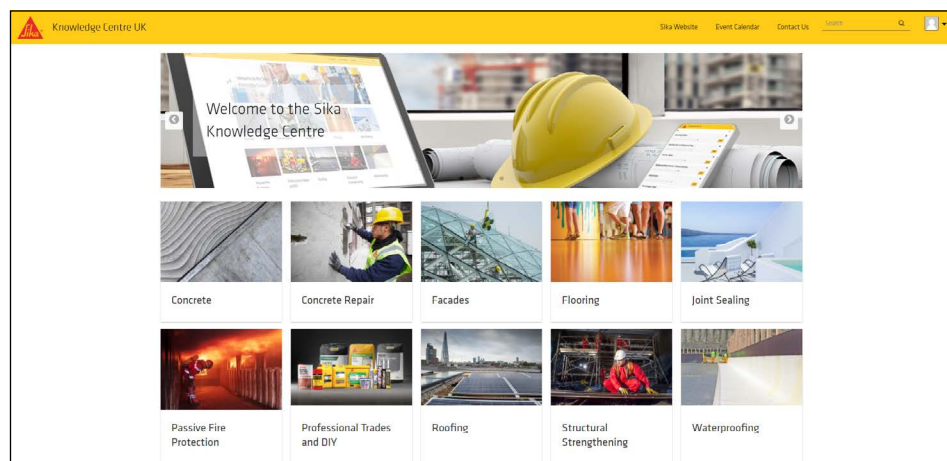
